You can display anything from a text file to a movie!

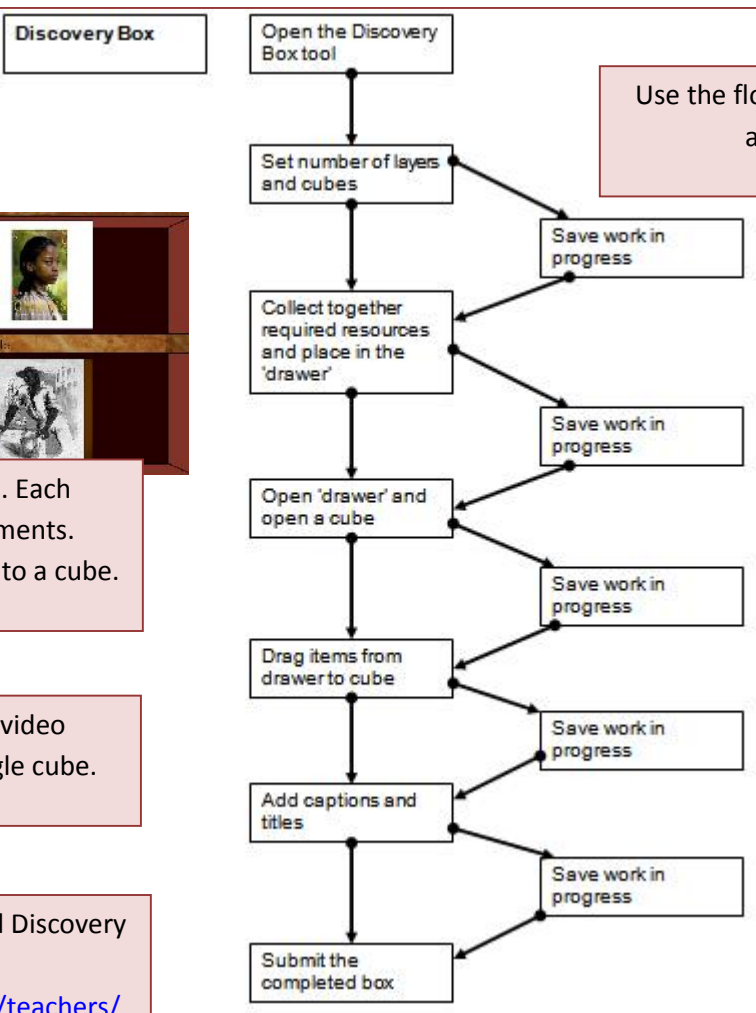

Use the flow diagram below to plan and create a box.

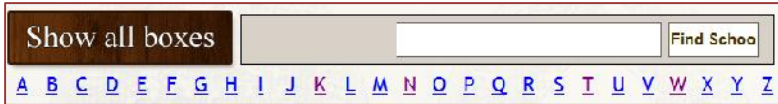
How to view a previously created Box

Just follow the six steps below to view a previously created Box.

1. Click on the Discovery Boxes tab at the top of the Home page



2. Use the search tool to find a school



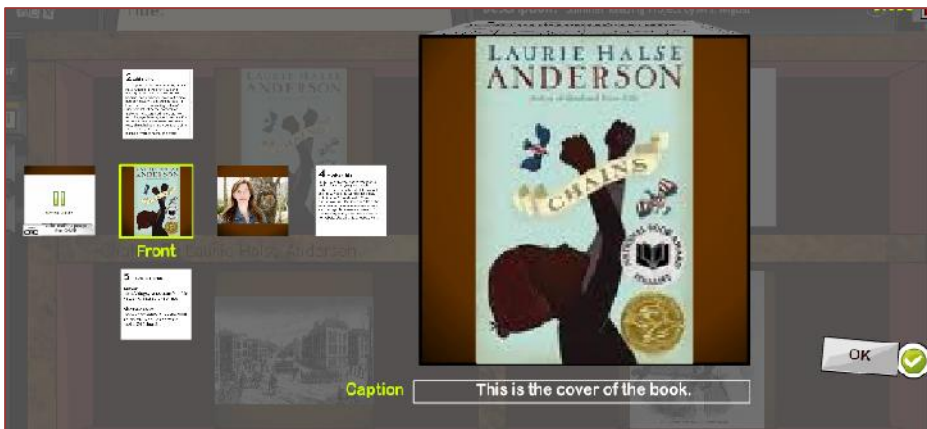
3. Open a box title

4. Select the layer to be viewed



5. Select a compartment. Click to open your selection. The items linked to the cube inside this compartment will be displayed. To enlarge an image or article click on its thumbnail.
